Aim of workshop / Brief description

The understanding of the best treatments for asthma and COPD are undergoing exciting changes and there are a number of new inhalers coming to market which reflects the updated GOLD and GINA guidelines. There is a growing recognition of the importance of managing co-morbidities and specifically adherence in order to achieve the national targets for reducing mortality from respiratory disease.
